

## **Possible Impacts of Marijuana Legalization Policies Upon Employers By Tony Coder**

**We will look at the possible impacts of marijuana legalization policies upon employers by analyzing ballot language that may be on the ballot in Ohio in 2014 and by looking at issues that other states are beginning to experience that effect the workforce and their families.**

### **Bio:**

Tony is the Assistant Director of Drug Free Action Alliance, a statewide non-profit focused on the prevention of drug use and abuse across the lifespan. In this role, he has set goals to increase advocacy opportunities for coalitions and individuals alike for the prevention of substance abuse and its related consequences. Tony is also a national presenter on the implications of marijuana legalization policies for business, law enforcement, education and healthcare and is on the National Board of Directors for Smart Approaches to Marijuana (SAM), led by former Congressman Patrick Kennedy. Prior to joining Drug Free Action Alliance, Tony worked with Ohio's First Lady Hope Taft on drug prevention and also served as the Legislative Director of the Ohio Department of Job and Family Services under Governor Ted Strickland. Tony is a two-time Telly-award winning video producer, winning for the Smart and Sober underage drinking prevention campaign which starred Henry Winkler and hip-hop star Bow Wow, and Finding Solace, a piece that encouraged advocacy in local communities to combat opiate misuse and abuse. Tony earned his Bachelor's of Arts in Communications from the University of Toledo.
